For most of us, change is uncomfortable because it requires us to...well...change also! Actually when we think about it, change is really not the issue because life is, by definition, dynamic...i.e. always changing. As believers, we are challenged to make judgments regarding whether we value certain changes. For example, there are many changes happening in our culture that I am vehemently opposed to from a Christian world view. My response to those changes is to express my opinion and communicate the reasons for my resistance. As a parent, I also have an obligation to teach my children how those changes may contradict the teachings of Scripture and try to illustrate the long, and short term dangers of embracing said change. All of this requires education, and that is also a goal of the church. In our Mission Statement, we say we are "A people gathered in Christ; nurtured in His Spirit; and sent in His name." I would argue that all three are essential if we are to be the church Christ has called us to be. Nurturing requires both change and helping others to see the dangers of some change. Nurturing can happen very effectively in small groups...say for example **Sunday School**...I hope to see you in a Sunday School class this Sunday!

 - **SCHOOL SUPPLIES** pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
 - **HYGIENE ITEMS** toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.
 - **OTHER** Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)
