On Wednesday night, February 21, we will once again worship together on *Ash Wednesday*. As you know this marks the beginning of Lent, and this is a season of reflection. I know that many of you are reading through the Bible with us in our *90 Days of Focus*, and it is very intentional and appropriate that Lent falls during these ninety days. As we read God's Word, and reflect upon who God is, it gives us a proper perspective on who we are in relationship to Him. I challenge you to remain faithful in your reading, and I know that the Lenten season will be even more meaningful as a result of your faithfulness!

Ultimately, our *90 Days of Focus* are leading us up to our Holy Week services and Easter Sunday morning. But, also remember that we are planning to begin revival services two weeks after Easter Sunday. Those services will be April 22-25, and our plans are to have the services on the front lawn!
