Hopefully we were able to answer many of the basic questions that we, as Christians, struggle with; however, I also am keenly aware that we don't have to have all the answers! We are children of truth, and as such we will learn more as we read and study more. I am convinced that God will reveal what we need to know as we seek His will and His time.

I believe the next step for us as children of truth is to share what we are learning with others who are seeking truth.
