In two weeks (February 3rd) we will begin our winter lifestyle emphasis entitled, "Just Walk Across the Room," which will help us look at the way we encounter people daily, focusing on building relationships as the platform for sharing the Gospel. I am really excited about this emphasis, and we will have small group studies and worship services built around that theme just like we did with the "WHY?" series. So many times we are reluctant to follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit because: 1) We're so busy we do not recognize His leading; or 2) We are afraid to be obedient for fear that we don't know exactly what to do. In an age where advance planning and control are valued so highly, it is uncomfortable for many people to enter into an encounter that the Holy Spirit is controlling. In "Just Walk Across the Room," we will learn historically how we got to the point where we felt little or no responsibility for personal evangelism, and we'll discover how God can use us each day if we will just trust Him! I challenge you to sign up for one of the small study groups that will be meeting on weeknights or attend the Sunday evening group. You can also invite others from the community/work/school. There will be promotional materials at the Welcome Center that you can use to "get the word out!"

A NOTE FROM MARY

Most of the verses written about praise in God's word were voiced by people faced with crushing heartaches, injustice, treachery, slander, and scores of other difficult situations. -Joni Eareckson Tada

Over and over in scripture, I am reminded that praise is a choice, and I am convinced repeatedly that true praise is often not the easy choice. We have all experienced those times when praise comes easily, when all is going well and it is easy to be thankful and in awe of God. However, I have come to realize that sometimes praise is an act of faith. It is the choice to believe that God is on His throne in the midst of circumstances that would indicate otherwise. It is the act of saying, "Okay, God, I am not seeing or hearing you right now, but I know that you are there and that you still have me in the palm of Your hand, and I am going to proclaim how great You are in spite of all that is going on in my life." Over and over in the scriptures we see examples of those who chose to praise in spite of the difficulty of their circumstances. Paul, imprisoned, wrote, "Even if I die, I rejoice with you. So, you too should rejoice with me (Mary paraphrase Phil 2:17-18)." The Psalms are full of songs which honestly speak to God about injustice, fear, and loneliness, yet so many of these same songs end with proclamations of praise. One example is Psalm 42 which ends by saying, "Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my savior and my God."

Whatever you may encounter in coming days, I encourage you to choose to praise in the midst of every circumstance and heartache.
