A NOTE FROM MARY

Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good. - IPeter 2:1-3

In the last newsletter, I used the analogy of a baby's feeding habits with that of a Christian. I wanted to use the analogy to share one more thing with you. A few weeks ago, Rebecca was sick and I had to take her to

the doctor. After a thorough examination, he asked, "Is she still eating well?" He explained that although she wasn't feeling well, if she was eating it was probably nothing to worry about. I think this also fits our analogy. A healthy, growing Christian will be feeding on God's Word regularly whether he or she feels well or not. When things are not going well, the hunger will still be



there. However, I think when we quit feeding on the things of God, when we no longer feel that need or hunger, there is something spiritually wrong with us. It is a time to examine why we no longer desire that nourishment. A craving for the things of God is a sign of a healthy relationship with Him. It is an indicator that we desire to grow in His love and strength. How's your appetite?

That's right, we are headed to camp this summer, and you have to get your deposit in now if you want to go!


We are headed to Student Life Camp and it is going to be great!
