Our church began as a mission of First Baptist Church, and was called "Mission Sunday School" in its early days. The church was later named "College Park Missionary Baptist Church" when it was constituted on October 2, 1949. At that time, seventy-four individuals were recorded as charter members. The name was soon shortened to "College Park Baptist Church."
