Gilbert and Charlotte Shermer heard the request from the First Baptist Church pulpit in 1948. The request was made by Dr. Ralph Herring for a meeting place in the northwest part of the city to gather people interested in beginning a church in that area. The Shermers offered their home and their large backyard at 149 Rosedale Circle as a

meeting place. The first gathering took place on July 22, 1948, and two weeks later a small group of interested adults held the first Thursday night prayer meeting at the Shermer home. Throughout the summer the group grew and continued to meet there until cooler weather forced them to seek a facility with indoor meeting capabilities. What they chose was an unlikely worship shelter, a pavilion at a swimming pool called Crystal Lake.
