

"History Highlight"

C o l l e g e Park's very first building was a simple frame struc-

ture. The construction was not quite completed when the first service was held there on June 12, 1949. Some of the materials that had been used at Crystal Lake were reused in the new building. The front doors opened into a small foyer, which led to an open worship area with a choir loft at the back of the building. Two side rooms, originally used for Sunday School classes, opened to the larger room. When the Sunday School membership outgrew the small building and expanded into neighboring houses, the original structure provided classrooms for the nursery and beginners' departments.
