
A NOTE FROM MARY

On October 2, 1949, the Missionary Baptist Church was officially constituted at a spe-

cial afternoon service. Rev. Walter L. Warfford led the worship services for the church in his role as Pilot Mountain Baptist Associational Missionary. Dr. Ralph A. Herring, minister at First Baptist Church, delivered the sermon. The above photograph was taken in our first church during this special constitution service which officially established the church and recognized our seventy-four charter members. Several ministers from local Baptist churches also participated in this special business and worship service which concluded with the hymn, Blest be the Tie that Binds.
