IN TOUCH...with Jeff



Rev. Walter L. Warfford was the Pilot Mountain Baptist Associational Missionary. In this capacity, Rev. Warfford led the weekly prayer meetings at the Shermer's home, and assisted in organizing the new Baptist Mission Sunday School. In fact, Rev. Warfford composed the letter

to First Baptist Church which announced that the Mission Sunday School wanted to take the step to become constituted as a church. On October 1, 1950, Rev. Warfford became the first full-time pastor of College Park Baptist Church, and served as pastor until September 1, 1955.
