A NOTE FROM MARY

...every skilled person to whom the Lord has given skill and ability to know how to carry out all the work of constructing the sanctuary are to do the work just as the Lord commanded –Exodus 36:1

I do get a little excited when I read about the construction of the tabernacle. As the construction takes place, it is pointed out that God gave the skills and talents necessary to build the tabernacle. He had skilled woodworkers, metalworkers, workers of fabric, and even musicians to play later in the completed sanctuary. The community was full of artists who were busy doing their work each day, but who were given the opportunity to use their skills for the glory of God.

God has also gifted College Park with artists, musicians, and skilled workers. We see examples of that as skills are used in ministry in Kentucky and our community. I want to let you know of another opportunity to share the artistic talents God has placed in our midst. In conjunction with our 60th Anniversary activities this October, we are going to have an art exhibition. I know that we have painters,

"History Highlight"

College Park faced an exciting, but certainly concerning, predicament in the mid-



dle of 1956. Sunday School and church membership had grown to the point that church facilities were crowded, so a second worship service was added at 8:40 on Sunday morning. A committee was already in place to study the possibility of expanding the church complex. One step toward providing more classroom space was to purchase nearby houses, such as the McCormick house shown in the above photo, and convert them to Sunday School departments. Equipped with kitchens, restrooms, and classrooms, these houses provided much-needed space for a growing church.

Important Information from our Properties Committee

Placing thermostats on HOLD causes the heat/air systems to run continuously until someone remembers to take them off HOLD. Please do not place thermostats on HOLD. They will stay at that level for 2 hours and then return to their normal programming.
