

"History Highlight"

"Together We Build" was the capital campaign title to finance the first church expansion in 30 years. In 1995, Mrs. Dare Smith made a monetary gift of \$250,000 to the Together We Build campaign. In

recognition of this generous gift to the church, the new fellowship hall was named O. E. Smith Hall, in memory of the Smiths and their devotion to our church. Mr. and Mrs. Smith are pictured above. Church members toured the new building on January 5, 1997, and occupied the classrooms for the first time the following Sunday. Smith Hall and the new building were dedicated on May 4, 1997.
