The sanctuary cross which hangs over the baptistery was made and donated to the church by Ray Irvin in 1975. Mr. Irvin was a master woodworker and a member of the choir. He

was also married to Mrs. Doris Irvin, our church organist from 1957 to 1968. Mr. Irvin had a workshop behind his house on Ransom Road, and many church members own pieces of furniture that he made for them. Mr. and Mrs. Troy Wood donated the backdrop lighting to illuminate the cross.
