A NOTE FROM MARY



Vacations are lovely things. Every time I take one I am reminded that God created us as beings who need to rest and, dare I say it, play. Sometimes I forget that in the beginning God set aside a designated time for Sabbath. He didn't set aside a place, but a time. Now I have come to a point in my life where I truly believe that, more than any other thing, time is my most valued commodity. I hate to waste money, but I really hate to waste time. However, I realize at times that my need to be productive leads me to forget to rest. I have to remind myself to relax and rest, that God commands a Sabbath.

While on vacation, I read a *National Geographic* article about longevity. It followed people groups all around the world who had particularly long life spans and tracked what foods and habits were thought to lead to their long lives. One

"History Highlight"



Church members and guests were excited to attend the first worship service in the new sanctuary on June 13, 1954. Just two weeks later, the first baptism was held in the new building. Many church members and friends

of the church contributed money to purchase furnishings for the sanctuary, such as a pulpit, pulpit chairs, communion table, flower stands, hymnals, a piano, flowers, flower vase, Venetian blinds, and a water cooler. A service of dedication and an open house was held on October 3, 1954. This special date was also the fifth anniversary of the church constitution.
