## From Your Pastorna

Mountain Outreach. Those two words have been a call to action for twenty -two years, and last week we had wonderful closure in this chapter of our church history. Understandably, I have been asked many questions similar to, "Why can't we come back next year?" so I thought a word of clarity might be in order. Despite what you may have heard from the rumor mill, Roger Jones and I both received letters from Mountain Outreach last fall informing us that, due to financial short-falls in programming, College Park was not going to be able to build a house in Kentucky this summer. Because we are "self-contained" and very organized, the thought process was that we would have an easier time finding another place of service than some of the other churches who participate. When Barbie, Roger and I called from my office a couple of days after receiving the letter, we were told that we were the only church that would not be invited this year, and the stated reason was that Mountain Outreach simply could not afford the \$20,000+ that was necessary for site preparations. A later call-back from the University President to me reaffirmed this detail and also added that one site would be needed for the students who would be attending the newly added M-fuge conferences that the university would be hosting beginning this summer.

As you can imagine there was a little panic, but we were confident God would open another door. We agreed that we would confirm another place of service so that announcement could correspond with the news that we would not be permitted to work on a Mountain Outreach site this summer. So the search began, and we had actually found a very good possibility by the time that Roger received a call from the Mountain Outreach Director in January of this year. During the call, Roger was informed that the program had received a grant of \$25,000 and we would be able to participate this summer after all, but reiterated that this was just for this summer, and the situation as outlined in the fall letter was still the same.

Obviously we were saddened that our twenty-two-year run was coming to an end, but were very thankful that we would have a year for closure and additional time to find a place of service for next summer. We were also aware that our planning and preparation process would not allow us to wait and see each subsequent year since additional funding may not come until spring, if at all!

Personally, I am grateful for the twenty-two years that we have been able to spread the love of Jesus to the people of Whitley County. I am also excited for the thousands of teenagers that will experience Mountain Outreach through their M-fuge experience this summer and summers to come. I wait with eager anticipation to see what God is going to do in the future through College Park!
