I started to put a hymn in here this week that talked about answering God's summons to act in the world. It was a really good one, and you'll probably see it sometime in the near future. However, just as I got finished typing it in, I got an email from an old friend. We have been comparing calendars for weeks, and we can't find a time to get together. As I was thinking about her, I was reminded of something she said to me once upon a time. We were sitting in her office discussing the possibility of my coming to College Park. I was talking about how things had come about and how I was pretty confident that God was leading me in this direction. I was also discussing all the changes that moving would mean for my family and the uncertainty of uprooting the family and everything that went with it when my friend said to me,

"It seems to me if you are who you say you are, and you believe what you say you believe, then you have to follow God no matter what."

Now, this seems like not that big of a statement for us church folk, but my friend is not exactly church folk. She was raised in church but left it after experiencing a lot of un-Christlike behavior and attitudes. Nowadays, she prides herself on being open-minded as she explores many religions. But when she spoke that day, she was exactly right. And in remembering today, I am reminded that people are watching. They are watching to see if we really believe what we say we believe. They are watching to see if we mean what we say. And I am reminded that God speaks even through those who might not have given themselves to Him, that He is at work through those who might not even recognize Him. And, once again, I am challenged and amazed.

Have you picked up your envelope yet?

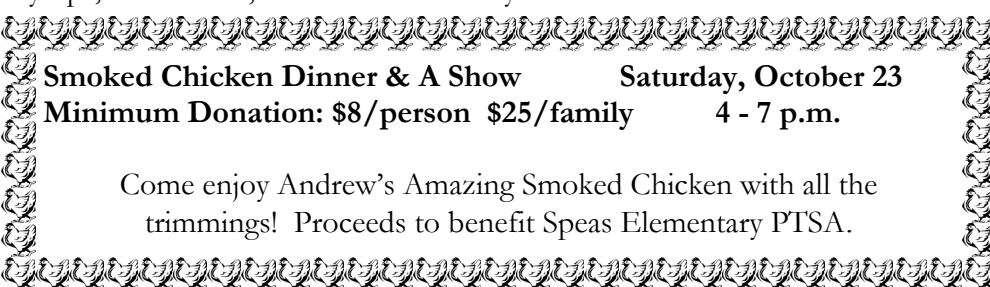
