In our consumer driven society the most common phrase I hear in discussions about worship is: "I need somewhere that can meet my needs" (or similar wording). That is really fascinating statement considering worship of our Creator God should not be focused on us at all, but on Him! Our concern in worship should not be whether it pleases us...but whether it is pleasing to Him! Yet we live in a world that has become so self absorbed that we have completely lost sight of why we worship...and WHO we worship. So here is my challenge: This week before you come to worship, prepare your heart to worship God, not your own selfish needs. As we plan our worship service, we will seek to plan a worship experience that will allow us to focus on God and His grace, and a by-product of that experience may be that our hearts are made more full by understanding our relationship to Him.

So our goal should be to learn more about how to have the kind of relationships that God desires for us, and to spend time and developing those kind of energy relationships. I am sure that each of us knows someone "outside" of the church could use guidance that encouragement in relationship-building (or restoration). Take a few minutes this week to invite that person to be with us this Sunday!

Summer Mission Committee

The Summer Mission Committee has been working on an alternate location for our traditional Mountain Outreach building project. We are happy to report that we have a new location to do this exciting service.

The committee has made several trips to Grifton Mission Ministry in Pitt County, NC. After Hurricane Floyd, College Park assisted with repairs to 13 homes in this area. It is the recommendation of this committee that we travel to the Greenville area (about 3 hours away) and build a home for a needy family. The coordinator of Grifton Mission Ministries, Billy Tarlton, will work with Pitt County officials to select the family. There will likely be some building funds available to help with the cost of construction. We anticipate the cost to College Park to be comparable to previous years.

There will be information presented on Wednesday, March 16. There will be a called church conference on Sunday, March 20, during both morning services to vote on this recommendation from the Summer Mission Committee. The recommendation is to build a home in Pitt County on July 2 - 8, 2011.
