A NOTE FROM MARY



I was sitting in the chair in the middle of a badly-needed haircut appointment this morning and contemplating what to write in the newsletter. Not surprisingly, I remembered Matthew 10:30 which says that even the very hairs of your head are numbered. And then I chuckled because I realized that not only does God know how many hairs are on my head, He knows how many of them are gray (a quickly growing, and ever-changing number!) And then I thought that the same God who is familiar with all my ways (Psalm 139:3) knows how much vanity is involved in me getting up early on my day off to get my hair cut. I have taken a few weeks to reflect on the recent Dinner and a Show and I want to say thank you publicly to all who made it such a huge success. The Youth Ministry Council began planning several months back and we knew that a Dinner and a Show would be a daunting task. Even so, the council moved forward with a great deal of faith that this event was part of God's mission for our youth ministry. With the decision made, lead teams were formed and plans were developed. Tickets sales and promotion began, meal and show preparations were made, and all the teams did their work with great energy. Then the time for the event came. By the end of the weekend God showed up in ways we could not have imagined!

Our youth ministry could have tried other fund raising events. We certainly would have succeeded at raising a good amount of money for future youth mission efforts. I believe, however, that God honored the risk we took. Faith is risk (see Hebrews 11). I do not wish to equate something like a Dinner and a Show to life's most difficult questions, but I believe there is a great lesson which was learned. The tangible signs of a successful event were evident - over 14 sponsors, greater than 200 tickets sold, more than \$3500 raised for youth missions. There were also less tangible signs of success - the relationships which deepened among our youth, families, and church members; the stepping up of so many of our youth while doing difficult work of selling, serving and using their gifts; the memories which were made and will last for years to come. I believe this is where the true success lies.

Thank you to every youth, parent, youth leader, and church member who threw their hat in to the ring, stepped out on faith, and let God do a miracle in our church. I am blessed to walk with you in faith!
