During our Lenten journey this spring, there will be several events in the life of our church that are note-worthy.

March 11-14 are the days that a group of adults and college students will be going to Pitt County (Grifton), NC on their annual College Mission Trip. This trip's purpose is to provide some basic human needs related to safety and shelter for those who are in need. The need for physical security and safety is one of the most basic human needs, and the students and adults attending will work hard to have maximum impact in a "short week."

March 25th is the day scheduled for a Called Church Conference to vote on the recommendations as presented by our Facility Update Committee. Recommendations will include proceeding financing of the approved construction of the gymnasium and educational building connector with welcome/check-in area, the renovation/upgrade of Smith Hall. Also open for church vote will be the consideration of two or three other facility update concerns. All of this information will be discussed in the weeks leading up to the church conference, so please pay close attention to the schedule of the information sessions.

April 1-7 is Holy Week, and is also the week that our high school youth will be on mission in Jamaica. This week is obviously important because it is Holy Week, but it is significant for our youth because many of them will experience Holy Week in an entirely different culture. The same God will be worshipped, albeit in completely different surroundings and with believers who may have completely different traditions from us...

Different traditions...can God possibly transcend these? Of course He can! Church building programs...can God be glorified and served through the expansion of physical structures or the security of dwellings made secure by college students? Of course He can...and will!

Facility Update Committee Announcement

As we celebrate what God has done in the recently completed renovation of the education building, the church looks forward to the construction of the approved gymnasium and renovations of Smith Hall. In addition to these projects, our committee has become aware of other construction/ renovation needs. This includes the long-discussed connector between the sanctuary and chapel as well as additional renovations deemed necessary due to the recent space swap between the Adult Four (4) and Youth Departments.

The Facility Update Committee and the Finance Committee have been working in tandem to prepare a proposal that will meet these facility needs from both a construction and financial perspective. Both committees are eager to present this detailed proposal to the church in order to bring the congregation up-to-date on all that is planned. Several presentations have been scheduled throughout the month of March. In fact, we have scheduled six (6) separate meetings where you can hear the presentation and have your questions answered.
