# HOME Hands On Mission Effort

Your HOME Mission Committee has been gathering data for a project to recommend for this summer. We have reviewed the experience last summer and listed the "goods" and the "bads." We have met with Billy and Shane Tarlton, Directors of Grifton Mission Ministry to discuss improvements we can make in another experience down east.

We are ready to suggest that College Park Baptist Church return to Greenville, NC to build a home in Pitt County.

- We will work with Grifton Mission Ministry (GMM).
- We will coordinate with Pitt County, a town government (most likely Winterville), and the US Department of Agriculture.
- GMM will assist by having the foundation and flooring in place before we arrive.

Because of high wind rules, multiple inspections, and more precise work required, our one-week goal must be modified. GMM will do all the finish work on the house.

The dates we suggest are July 1 - 6, 2012.

College Park will be called into conference on Wednesday, March 14 to vote on this project.

Our goal remains to create a plan that will enhance the overall ministry of the church to our community.

Due to this excellent feedback, we realized adjustments needed to be made to the meeting schedule originally unveiled in the recent letter sent to the membership as well as the last edition of "Highlights." Here is the updated schedule:
