As we discovered, or re-discovered, the five purposes of the church as demonstrated in Acts, chapter two, we were challenged to act upon what we learned. Let's review these purposes once more, and what the challenges will look like going forward.


- Week one we talked about developing *authentic community* so College Park would be the kind of place where we can personally experience love, encouragement and support. The ongoing challenge is to join a small group or class where you can experience authentic community.
- 2) Week two we discussed that we are wired for worship. Romans 12:1, tells us worship is a verb that should touch all aspects of our lives throughout the week as well as on Sundays. Our challenge is to attend

faithfully the worship services of College Park, and to "take our everyday, ordinary lives—our sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking around lives," and give them to God as an act of worship.

- 3) The topic for week three was *spiritual growth.* In order to get and stay spiritually fit, our challenge is to spend time with God in Bible study and prayer every day.
- Week four challenged our notion of stewardship. Our challenge is to continue taking steps forward from where we are in our stewardship.
- 5) Week five we learned how much Jesus values those who are lost...and we should too! Our challenge is to reach beyond our walls and help bring those who are lost to a saving relationship with Jesus!


