We're Feeding Hungry Children!

This school year a new ministry project at College Park was begun to help fight childhood hunger in our city. A national study conducted in 2010 revealed that the greater Winston Salem area (which includes some surrounding counties) had the highest incidence of childhood hunger in the country! It is an unbelievable statistic.

In order to combat childhood hunger in our area, the WMU now sponsors a backpack program that provides backpacks filled with nutritious, kid-friendly foods to children on the weekends. Many children rely on school breakfast and lunch for the majority of their sustenance during the week and don't have access to much food on the weekend. This program is designed to help bridge that gap.

In October, we began providing backpacks to 9 children at Vienna Elementary. Due to generous donations of both food and money, we are getting ready to expand the program and provide backpacks for 15 children at Old Richmond. The feedback that has been received from the teachers and families of these children has been tremendous, and we are so grateful to know that we are helping to make a difference in the lives of these children.

We have partnered with Second Harvest Food Bank and are able to buy food for these children through the food bank at a great value. The cost of providing a backpack of food to a child each week is approximately \$5. You could sponsor a child for \$20/month, or a child could be sponsored for the remainder of the school year for only \$45. All donations may be made to the church office and designated for the backpack program.
