For the third year in a row, College Park is partnering with Grifton Mission Ministries to provide safer living conditions for the residents of Pitt County. In previous years, we have had the opportunity to build an entirely new house from the foundation to the furnishings, replacing old condemned houses with brand new houses! Unfortunately, Pitt County is experiencing a funding shortage and is unable to provide the same assistance for a whole house project this summer. Taking the time to build whole houses has made a huge impact on a few of the residents of Winterville. However, this year we have the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of a greater number of residents by building ramps that attach to their houses. This year we will still be able to work side by side to construct the ramps in a centralized location. Once a ramp is complete, a smaller team will install the ramps at their new residence. Each year the community has taken notice of our Christ-like love as we help to provide for those in need of assistance. Let's continue this year, not for our own recognition, but to be the body of Christ and shine His light in the darkness.

... A Giving Testimony...

As I was growing up, my mom was a widow raising two small children as a single working mother. She didn't make much money, but I always noticed that she put her envelope in the collection plate every Sunday. When I asked her about this, she instructed me that we are always to "pay God first." She then went on to tell me that during tough financial times when she didn't know how she could tithe and also have enough money to live on, God always provided. She shared with me numerous examples of this including one that has always stuck with me. One month she didn't know how she would make it to the end of the month financially. She went ahead and put her tithe in the collection plate anyway. The following week, "out of the blue," she received a phone call from a savings and loan company that had found an old account. It was an account that my father had opened and the amount in it was just enough to get her through the month!

She also taught me that God expects those of us who are blessed to use those blessings to give back and to bless others. The expectation was to tithe. I cannot say that our family has always tithed our full 10%, especially in the early years of our marriage. But over the years, we increased our giving each year until we reached our 10% tithe and have kept tithing ever since. And my mother was right, God has always provided! We have done our best to pass these same lessons on to our children. *-Anonymous*
