It hasn't captured me like other games. This time of year I find myself a little lost as people discuss their brackets. One thing I enjoy hearing about this time of year is the upsets, the Cinderella stories, the unlikely candidates to take it all. And this year, as I have been following the Monday morning study, I am reminded that God is a God of upsets and Cinderella stories. Over and over again He chooses the most unlikely candidates to do His work. The book of Genesis reveals a God who chooses those who do not know Him and those who know Him and still go their own way.
