# A NOTE FROM MARY

We are in the middle of a household project at our house, one of those projects that starts out with one simple thing that leads to the next thing and the next until nothing is simple anymore. As I type, I am surrounded by piles of stuff: stuff to go to Goodwill, stuff to be moved from one place to another, a lot of

stuff. I have to admit it feels good to de-clutter a little (even though the interim piles make me crazy). It has been an interesting process, though, as I decide what needs to be kept and what goes. Sometimes there are things that I don't need but still want to keep because of the attached memories. The object is not important, but the person associated with it is. I realize that what I am really wanting to hold on to is the relationship, not the object.

At the same time, I am preparing to make a difficult phone call this afternoon to a friend and mentor who is living his last days. I realize I don't have any "stuff" to remember him by, just a lot of great memories of doing ministry together, and of his encouragement as I was beginning to sort out God's call

on my life. I am reminded of what Ramon points out at many of the funerals he preaches: that all we take from this life is relationships. One of my favorite theology classes was all about God being a relational God, God in three persons in relationship with each other in relationship with us. He created us in His image, relational.
