A NOTE FROM MARY



O Lord, the house of my soul is narrow; enlarge it that You may enter in. It is ruinous, O repair it! It displeases Your sight. I confess it, I know. But who shall cleanse it, to whom shall I cry but to You? Cleanse me from my secret faults, O Lord, and spare Your servant from strange sins. -St Augustine of Hippo

In our Monday morning Bible study this week, we discussed why it is so much easier to proclaim to others the love of God than to discuss our sinfulness and need of Him. We like to use words like love, mercy, and grace but don't like to talk about why there is a need for mercy and grace. Perhaps we don't want to seem hypocritical or come off as judgmental. Maybe we think that the mention of sin will keep others from hearing us at all; however, I daresay that most people will admit to times in their life when they have not done what they should or have done what they shouldn't. Even if they don't use the word "sin" most will admit mistakes, poor judgment, or words they wish they could get back. They might even allude to other sin issues. Ultimately, we don't have to know what sins others carry, but we do have to let others know there is One who knows it and loves them already. We have to let others know that God loves them in spite of their sinfulness. Which shows the greater love: a Father who feels no need for our holiness and just blindly loves, or a God who knows the deepest part of ourselves which we would keep secret and who loves us enough to pay the price for those things so we can be in relationship with Him? We do our God an injustice when we don't talk about sin because others cannot know the full depth of His love until they understand how great His mercy truly is.
