The Angels' Share by James Markert-When a drifter is buried near the family distillery, people begin to visit and experience miracles. Some believe the drifter was the second coming of Christ, others doubt. William just wants to know what the connection is between the tragic death of his little brother and the drifter.

The Feathered Bone by Julie Cantrell- When her daughter's best friend disappears on a field trip Amanda is chaperoning, she is overcome with guilt. As she continues to search, Amanda struggles with depression and family issues. She searches for hope in the midst of the darkness.
