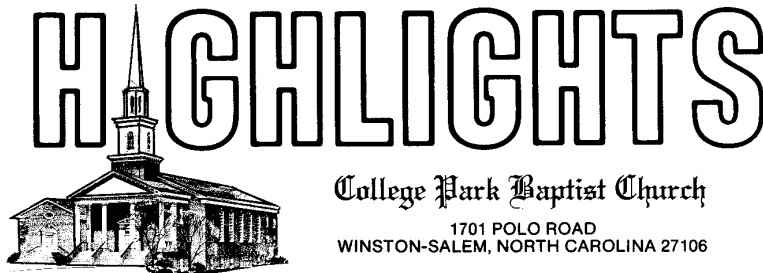

RAMON'S UPDATES

In his book entitled “Effective Evangelistic Churches,” Thom Rainer clearly identifies several characteristics of the most evangelistic churches within the Southern Baptist Convention. The most common characteristics of these churches who are showing strong growth through conversion of new believers (not believers transferring membership) are: 1) Evangelism is stressed and preached from the pulpit; 2) Prayer is seen as vital to the life of the church; 3) Sunday School is still recognized as the outreach arm of the church; 4) Worship (in whatever style) leads worshippers to encounter God and recognize Him as the true God revealed through Scripture; 5) Church leadership understands the “go mentality” and leads by example; 6) Community ministries and missions are not optional; 7) Discipleship is vital. Of course the book supports these with statistics, but we don’t need statistics...we’ve got the New Testament! If we want to call ourselves a New Testament church, then we should find joy in helping “not-yet-believers” come to know Christ as their personal Savior. In this process, we cannot forget that prayer is essential! **Reach Ten for Him** is based on these very principals of evangelism, and I hope that you will be a part of the exciting opportunities we have to share Christ during this season of the year.

Our youth are developing a clear understanding of what it takes to reach people for Christ, and they will be “taking it to the beach” this weekend as they lead worship services at/on Virginia Beach this Palm Sunday! They will spend all day Saturday involved in creative ministries on the beach and inviting people to the services, which will be held three different times on Sunday! Please pray for this bold witness experience!
