I am grateful for the opportunity to go with the Advance Team of sixteen, even at 5:00 a.m. Arriving at Williamsburg, we were greeted warmly by the new director of Mt. Outreach, David Honeycut and the Construction Manager, Ed Woods. It was most enjoyable to have lunch at Cumberland College, to see students who have worked with our volunteers in past summers, and to meet the students who will work this July with our church group!

The three homes that were built by College Park and Clemmons First Baptist last year were all beautiful and well kept. Much of the landscaping had been upgraded, which improved the area immensely. Nearby was the beginning of the 100th home for Mt. Outreach, which will be finished this summer.

We were looking forward to a visit with the Jeff and Pamela Siler family and were pleased to find a large family, mostly adults, who were so appreciative of the opportunity to get a home. The children were in the age range of 15 years to 24 years. The site is near Jellico and is a very desirable piece of land—very flat and an easy access to a motel and shopping areas.
