Sometimes you get so accustomed to the "way we've always done it" that you overlook some obvious advantages of doing it differently. Such is the case with our children's choirs. For years our children's choirs have rehearsed at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, after which our children have grabbed a bite of supper and then gone to mission groups at 6:45 p.m. It has always been a struggle for some of our families to have the children here by 5:30 p.m. In addition, we have had some minor problems with the supervision of children between 6:15 and 6:45 p.m. It now seems an obvious choice to move children's choirs to 6 p.m. They will rehearse until 6:45 p.m. and then be dismissed directly to mission groups. For those families who have tight schedules, they will now have an extra 30 minutes to get their children here. For those who eat supper here at church, they will have until 6 p.m. to eat together. We will begin this schedule next Wednesday, October 1. To our members who do not have children in choir, we would ask that you be sensitive to the need of choir families to have enough time to eat together before 6 p.m.

A reminder to all our Sunday rehearsal choirs (*Youth Vocal Ensemble, Ainesis, Channels, Sanctuary Bells*) that we will not rehearse this Sunday, September 28, because of the Block Party.
